### **Approval of Minutes**

Trustee Lou Monville called the committee to order. The minutes of the July 15, 2008 meeting were approved as submitted. Trustee Monville stated that there were no action items.

The Committee then heard from CSUEU President Pat Gantt who urged the CSU Community to continue with the efforts of the CSU Alliance to save the CSU's budget. He especially acknowledged the efforts of CSU Fresno President John Welty and Trustee Robert Linscheid.

CSUEU Vice President Dennis Dillon then gave an update on the Unit 13 – English as a Second Language Program - bargaining at Cal State Los Angeles.

Finally, UAPD President Floyd Anscombe highlighted the Physican's unique role in the system as the champion of student health. He then urged the CSU to consider the effects on student welfare when contemplating potential outsourcing of student health care such as at San Jose.
