





• What is in the ASI Beach Pantry?


- Perishable and non-perishable food



Gift card purchases during fundraisers do not count towards total donated sales, but purchases made with an existing gift card will count.








Beach Bites App

The BeachBites mobile food app addresses the issues of food waste and food security by connecting students to extra food from oncampus events and meetings.




